To enjoy an exclusive 5-star two-week trip for two in the Land of the Gods, you should plan to spend approximately USD20,317.³



NEW YORK

New York City, also known as the "Big Apple," offers a wide range of experiences to suit everyone. Whether it's touring the iconic landmarks, exploring the many museums rich in culture and history or the excitement of a Broadway musical, New York has so much to do, one visit will never be enough. A one-week trip for two to the city that never sleeps could cost approximately **USD13,762**.²



PARIS

Paris is a popular destination for Indians due to its romantic atmosphere, fashion, and art. It has a diverse population that caters to all types of travellers. There are plenty of attractions, from the historic landmarks of the Eiffel Tower and Arc de Triomphe, to the Louvre Museum and the famous Moulin Rouge. A two-week trip for two can cost around USD20,119.²



MALDIVES

Have you considered visiting the Maldives when you retire? This archipelago boasts over a thousand luxurious and regal islands for you to enjoy and explore. Whether you're looking to unwind or embark on an adventure, the Maldives has something for everyone. A one-week stay for two at a five-star resort during high season will cost around USD23,606.4



LONDON

With over 30 million visitors each year, London is one of the most popular destinations for travellers from around the globe. Renowned for its rich history, no visit would be complete without a tour of famous landmarks, such as Buckingham Palace, St. Paul's Cathedral and the Tower of London. Whilst there you can also indulge in a little luxury retail therapy at the famous Harrods or dine at one of the Michelin-starred restaurants that call London their home. A lavish one week trip for two would cost you around USD9,464.²

If you were retiring in 2023, ticking all of these once in a lifetime adventures off your bucket list would cost somewhere in the region of USD105,000. However, retiring in 10 years' time, the cost could be closer to USD170,000 and in 20 years' time, could be more than USD280,000, when allowing for inflation*.
